	TENT - Our curriculum enables children to express their ideas and thoughts in French and provides opportunities to interact and communicate with others both in speech and in writing ench-speaking countries and communities. In LKS2, children acquire basic skills and understanding of French with a strong emphasis placed on developing their Speaking and Listening sl KS2, alongside Reading and Writing, gradually progressing onto more complex language concepts. Our aim is to help children grow into curious and confident language learners and to pr rther language studies. Our core values in French are compassion, friendship, and respect. IPLEMENTATION - Lessons and resources help children to build on prior knowledge alongside the introduction of new skills. Revision of previous learning is built into each lesson, as well ammatical structures. IPLACT - Children will be able to read and write about a variety of topics in French and engage in conversations. They will become enthusiastic and inquisitive about languages.
