## **HISTORY**

INTENT – Luddenden CE School is committed to providing an environment which celebrates and encourages difference, innovation and courage. Our History curriculum aims to ensure that all pupils develop an appreciation the rich history of their locality and coherent knowledge, understanding and curiosity about the past in our local area, Britain and the wider world. Pupils will learn about and take inspiration from a wide range of influential historical figures. They will be encouraged to ask perceptive questions, think critically, weigh evidence, sift arguments, and develop perspective and judgement, thus enabling them to begin to understand the complexity of people's lives, the process of change, the diversity of societies and relationships between different groups, as well as their own identity and the challenges of their time. Our core values in History are respect, compassion, friendship and courage.

IMPLEMENTATION – In order to heighten interest and enthusiasm for history, we adopt an approach where pupils can become immersed in their studies. Pupils will experience a range of well-planned historical learning activities that provide stimulating, real-life contexts for learning. We create opportunities for our pupils to use their own understanding of our world to meaningfully acknowledge the impact of the past. We make best use of cross-curricular links and books to enhance historical learning. History will be used to teach pupils directly about diversity and anti-discrimination – pupils will be taught black history and will learn about important figures from minority/underrepresented groups.

IMPACT – The history curriculum reflects the diversity of the world. Pupils experience multidimensional learning about the past and begin to understand the implications and impact of Britain's past upon its subject peoples. Pupils are interested in the past and accomplishments.
